OUTSIDE ATTRACTION – ALSO KNOWN AS DOUBLE HANDLING

Reminder to all exhibitors:-

The Kennel Club is adopting a strict approach to double handling and all exhibitors are reminded of the provisions of the Regulations in respect of this. Please note that under Kennel Club Regulations the Show Management may order that Judging be suspended and/or a class may be abandoned. The abandonment of a class is clearly an outcome that benefits no-one but it is nonetheless a necessary final step to ensure the practise of double handling is prevented and to allow all exhibitors to compete in a fair environment.

RULES & REGULATIONS cont.....

Withdrawal from other competition. Dogs which become eligible for Best in Show may be withdrawn from all other competition other than breed classes, prior to the competition for Best in Show as appropriate in order to remain unbeaten. A dog beaten in competition for Best in Show may subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible. However, the dogs declared Best in Show & Reserve Best in Show must not compete in any subsequent competition.

Proviso: For the purpose of this Regulation, dogs beaten in competition for Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace and Team or a Special Award confined to a single breed, will not be considered to be beaten dogs.

13) Exhibits will not be admitted to Best In Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with the special permission of the Show Management.

14) No modifications will be made to this schedule except by permission of the General Committee of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine Press wherever possible.

15) All exhibitors must be familiar with K C Regulation F (Annex B-Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition).

16) All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the Show can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor.

Trade Stands. The Committee can accept no responsibility for products advertised or sold by stand holders at the Show and remind exhibitors that grooming products on sale may not meet the requirements of the Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition. Exercise Area.

An exercise area will be provided. Exhibitors/Handlers are required to clear up any fouling by the dog(s) in their charge.

RULES & REGULATIONS

- 1) The Show will open at 9.00am.
- 2) Dogs will be received at any time but it is the exhibitors' responsibility to ensure that exhibits are available for judging when required.
- 3) Judging will commence at 9.30am.
- 4) Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed. They may not be removed earlier unless by written order of the Hon. Vet or of the Show Management and then only in exceptional and unforeseen circumstances which must be reported to the KC. The Show will close 30 minutes after all judging has been completed.
- 5) The use of cooking stoves in the proximity of the tenting and benching areas is forbidden except as authorised by the Show Management.
- 6) Entry fees: £15.00 first class per dog. Subsequent entries with SAME dog £5.00. Catalogues not collected by noon will be sold.
- 7) There is no prize money on offer at this show.
- 8) The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries
- 9) Puppies under six calendar months of age on day of the Show are not eligible for exhibition.
- 10) The mating of bitches within precincts of the Show is forbidden.
- 11) There is no competition for Best Puppy in Show.
- 12) Best in Show must be selected from the exhibits declared Best of Sex provided that they are unbeaten winning dogs. Reserve Best in Show must be selected from the Best Opposite Sex and the Reserve Best of Sex to the exhibit declared Best in Show. The dogs declared Best in Show and Reserve Best in Show must not compete in any subsequent competition.

Judges may give verbal critiques on each exhibit at the end of each class, after judging of that class has been completed.

COVID 19 - If a competitor, or any one in their household, has COVID-19 related symptoms or has tested positive for COVID -19 they must not attend the event and self-isolate in line with Government advice.

DEFINITION OF CLASSES (the word “dog” includes both sexes)

In the following Definitions a Challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the Rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club. Show awards issued by the Irish Kennel Club which count towards the title of Champion shall be five point Green Stars or more.

Wins at Championship Shows in Breed Classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows.

In the case of dogs owned in partnership and entered in Members’ classes or competing for Members’ Specials, each partner must at the time be a member of the Society.

In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before closing of entries shall be counted when entering for any class. i.e. **Monday 20th September 2021**

Wins in Variety Classes do not count for entry in Breed Classes but when entering in Variety Classes wins in both Breed & Variety Classes must be counted. A First Prize does not include a Special Prize of whatever value.

If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered for which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:

1. WITHDRAWAL. The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulations F(1) 9(j) and 20.
2. TRANSFER a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its breed, colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height and, in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy & Puppy excepted, to the Open Class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.
3. b) For an exhibit entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy class, Puppy Class or Junior Class, which is over age but under 12 calendar months of age or 18 calendar months of age or 24 calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy Class, Junior Class or Yearling Class respectively for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height. In the event of there being no Puppy, Junior or Yearling Class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height to the Open class.
4. c) For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.
d) If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

With the above provisos the following are the Definitions of certain classes:

Minor Puppy: For dogs of six and not exceeding nine calendar months of age on the day of the show

Puppy: For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the day of the Show.

Junior: For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the day of the Show.

Yearling: For dogs of six and not exceeding twenty four calendar months on the day of the Show.

DEFINITION OF CLASSES (the word “dog” includes both sexes) Cont.....

Post Graduate: For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate/CACIB/CAC/Green Star or 5 or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open Classes, whether restricted or not, where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed..

Limit: For dogs which have not become Show Champions under the KC Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club or won 7 or more first prizes in all at Championship shows in Limit or Open Classes confined to the breed, whether restricted or not, at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the Breed.

Open: For all dogs of the breed for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show.

Special L/Coat Junior: Same as Junior but restricted to Long-coated German Shepherd Dogs.

Special L/ Coat Open: Same as Open but restricted to Long-coated German Shepherd Dogs.

Any GSD registered with the KC may enter any class for which it is eligible. In classes where the entry contains both long and ordinary coats the judge should place the exhibits according to their merits and not be influenced by coat. It should be noted that the winners of any of the above classes including the special classes for Long Coated GSDs can be considered for the challenge Certificate providing the exhibit has not been beaten in any other class.

Please note re Long Coat Classes: Special Long Coat classes do not qualify for Crufts.

A judge cannot be appointed to only judge Long Coat classes.

Eligibility for Best of Sex/the CC is at the discretion of the Judge. However it would be expected that unbeaten winning dogs from the Special Long Coat classes would be called to compete for Best of Sex/the CC.
