OUTSIDE ATTRACTION - ALSO KNOWN AS DOUBLE HANDLING

Reminder to all exhibitors: - The Kennel Club is adopting a strict approach to Double Handling and all exhibitors are reminded of the provisions of the Regulations in respect of this. Please note that under Kennel Club Regulations the Show Management may order that judging be suspended and /or a class be abandoned. The abandonment of a class is clearly an outcome that benefits no-one but it is nonetheless a necessary final step to ensure the practise of double handling is prevented and to allow all exhibitors to compete in a fair environment.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. The Show will open at 9.15am.
2. Dogs will be received at any time but it is the exhibitor's responsibility to ensure that exhibits are available for Judging when required.
3. Judging will commence at 10.00am
4. Exhibits maybe be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed. The show will close half an hour after all the judging has been completed.
5. Entry fees £10.00 per dog for the first class, subsequent entry for the same dog £5.00 (£1.00 Not for Competition) MUST ACCOMPANY ENTRIES. Catalogues may be pre-paid with the entry fee at £3.00 each (£4.00 on the day). Crossed cheques or postal orders should be drawn in the favour of Leicestershire German Shepherd Dog Club. Any cheques returned to the club will be referred to the exhibitor together with any bank charges incurred and part of the Kennel Club's Ruling, Exhibitors requiring a receipt of entry should enclose a stamped addressed envelope with their entry form.
6. PRIZE MONEY: No Prize money will be paid at the Show.
7. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
8. Puppies under six calendar months of ages on the first day of the Show are not eligible for exhibition.
9. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.
10. Best Puppy in Show - Where a best puppy in show competition is scheduled, the Best Puppy in show is a puppy which has competed and is unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited ash the same show. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the show. Where the Best in Show is a puppy it will also atomically be Best Puppy in Show. Similarly, if the reserve Best in Show is a Puppy, which has only been beaten by an Adult dog, it will also atomically be Best Puppy in Show. Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best in Show. Best puppy in Show must be selected from puppies which have been judged and which are unbeaten by any other puppy. puppies which become eligible for Best Puppy in Show may be withdrawn from all other Competition, other than breed classes prior to the Competition for Best Puppy in Show as appropriate, in order to remain unbeaten, a puppy beaten in Competition for best put-up in show may subsequently be exhibited in all Competition for which it was previously eligible. The dog declared Best Puppy in show, however, must not compete in any subsequent Competition. Proviso - For the purpose of this regulation dogs beaten in completion for stud dog, brood Bitch, progeny, brace and team for a special award confined to one breed will not be considered to be a beaten dog.
11. Best in Show must be selected from the exhibits declared best of Sex but only if they have received a first prize in a class at the same show. If a Reserve Best in Show is to be selected, the eligible dogs are those declared Best opposite Sex and Reserve Best of Sex to the exhibit declared Best in Show.
12. Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show Competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have ben unavoidably delayed by a previous judging not completed on ?me and then only with the special permission of the Show Management.
13. Exhibitors must not pick up dogs by their tails and leads when handling them nor handle a dog in a manner which causes its feet not to touch the ground when on the move, this is not acceptable. Exhibitors should note that such practice would constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under the Kennel Club Show Regulation F11.
14. All exhibitors must be familiar with eh Kennel Club Regulations (Annex B) – regulations for the preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
15. All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to compete number before entry to the Show/Event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
16. DOGS IN VEHICLES ON HOT DAYS – Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club regulations in this respect may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under the Kennel Club rules and regulations. Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events.
When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased me in traffic jams. If your vehicle is not air conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all. The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink. Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog. When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle. Keep your dog in the shade – take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated. Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended periods of time. Remember, if you feel hot your dog is likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to sire results. Please look after your dog's welfare. **WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORCIBLE ENRTY TO UOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.**
17. Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breech of the Kennel Club Regulations in respect may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under the Kennel Club Riles and regulations. The use of Pinch collars, electronic shock collars or prong collars is not permitted at any show licensed by the Kennel Club. This shall apply at the venue or within the precincts of the how.
18. Not for competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered.
19. No modifications will be made to the schedule except by permission of the Board of the Kennel Club which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine Press wherever possible.
20. Unauthorised Personnel – are not allowed in the ring: this includes the taking of Photographs and videos. Anyone wishing to take photos/videos must prior to the show make arrangements with the Secretary. Any unauthorised people will be removed immediately. A separate area will be allocated for photos away from the ring

CLASSIFICATION

DEFINITION OF CLASSES

In the following definitions, a challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel club.

Wins at Championship Shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Show.

In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Members' Specials each partner must at the time of the entry be a member to the Society.

In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of postal entries shall be counted when entering for any class i.e. **19th June 2022**.

Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in Breed classes but when entering in variety classes, wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. A first prize does not include a Special Prize of whatever value.

Is an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:- (1) WITHDRAWAL: The dog may be withdrawn from the competition subject to the conditions of regulations 9 (j) and 20.

(2) TRANSFER: a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted to the Open Class for the correct Colour, sex, weight or height. (b) if an exhibit has entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy Class, Puppy Class or Junior Class, which is over age but under the 12 calendar months of age, 18 calendar months of age or 24 calendar months of age respectively the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy Class, Junior Class or Yearling Class respectively for the correct Breed, colour, Sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no Puppy, Junior or yearling Class to the Open Class for the correct Breed, colour, sex, Weight or height. C) For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open Class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.

If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

MINOR PUPPY: For dogs of six and not exceeding nine calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

PUPPY: For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

JUNIOR: For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

YEARLING: For dogs of twelve and not exceeding twenty four calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

POST GRADUATE: For dogs which have not won a Change Certificate or five or more First prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit and Open Classes, whether restricted or not.

LIMIT: For dogs which have not become show Champions under the Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the kennel Club, or won 3 or more CC/CACIS/CAC/Green Stars or won 7 or more First prizes in all at Championship Shows in Limit or Open Classes confined to the Breed, whether restricted or not at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

OPEN: For all dogs of the breed for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show.

CHAMPION: For dogs which have been confirmed a Champion or Show Champion under Kennel Club regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club.

SPECIAL LONGCOAT JUNIOR: For Long Coat dogs of six and no exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

SPECIAL LONGCOAT OPEN: For all Eligible Long Coat Dogs

NOT FOR COMPETITION

Societies' may at their discretion, accept Not for Competition entries. Societies may accept such entries from breed of dog not included within the title of the Society and at shows held over more than one day, such entries may be accepted on the day from any breed. Not for competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered.

Note: The word "Dog" includes both sexes.

PLEASE NOTE OWNERS OF DOGS NOT ENTERED INTO THE SHOW OR NOT FOR COMPETITION MUST ON ARRIVAL SIGN A SPECTATOR DOG ACCEPTANCE FORM. THESE CAN BE FOUND AT THE SECRETARY TENT.
