DIRECTIONS TO THE SHOW

From the A1 Travelling South

Take the B12220 exit from the A1 signposted Carcroft. Stay on this road for approximately 1.3 miles then turn left on to Chestnut Lane. Turn left again in 350 yards and Bullcroft Memorial Hall is situated on the left in approximately 85 yards.

From the A1 (M) travelling North

Leave the A1(M) at junction 37 signposted A635. At the roundabout, take the 3rd exit onto Barnsley Road/A635. Turn left onto Scawsby Lane in ½ mile. At the roundabout, take the 2nd exit onto Doncaster Lane/B1220. Continue to follow B1220 for 1.9 miles then turn left onto Skellow Road / B1220. In 0.3 miles turn right onto Chestnut Ave., then turn left in approximately 350 yards. Bullcroft Memorial Hall is situated on the left in approximately 85 yards.

From the M1 travelling North

Leave the M1 at junction 32 on to the M18. Continue on the M18 for 8.7 miles then at junction 2 take the A1(M) exit. Keep right and merge onto the A1(M). Leave the A1(M) at junction 37 signposted A635. At roundabout, take the 3rd exit onto Barnsley road/A635. Turn left onto Great North Road /A638 in ½ mile. At the roundabout, take the 2nd exit onto Doncaster Lane /B1220. Continue to follow B1220 for 1.9 miles then turn left onto Skellow Road/B1220. In 0.3 miles turn right onto Chestnut Ave., then turn left in approximately 350 yards. Bullcroft Memorial Hall is situated on the left in approximately 85 yards.

From the M62 travelling East

At junction 32A, use the left 2 lanes to take the A1(M) exit, keep right at the fork and merge onto A1(M). Continue onto A1 and follow for approximately 6.6 miles. Take the B1220 exit from the A1 signposted Carcroft. Stay on this road for approximately 1.3 miles then turn left on to Chestnut Lane. Turn left again in 350 yards and Bullcroft Memorial Hall is situation on the left in approximately 85 yards

From the M62 travelling West

At junction 33, exit towards A1(S)A645/Services. At Ferrybridge Interchange, take the 1st exit onto the A1 slip road to A1/Doncaster/A638. Continue onto A1 and follow for approximately 7.3 miles. Take the B1220 exit from the A1 signposted Carcroft. Stay on this road for approximately 1.3 miles then turn left onto Chestnut Lane. Turn left again in 350 yards and Bullcroft Memorial Hall is situated on the left in approximately 85 yards.

Puppies aged 4 months and over on the first day of the show are eligible to enter 'not for competition' Please enter in the usual way enclosing the appropriate fees.

THE ATTRACTING OF THE ATTENTION OF EXHIBITS BY ANY METHOD FROM OUTSIDE THE RING PROHIBITED.

DEFINITION OF CLASSES

In the following definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts toward the title of Champion under the Rules of any governing body recognised by The Kennel Club. Wins at Championship Shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows. In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Members' Specials each partner must at the time of entry be a member of the Society. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of entries shall be counted when entering for any class: ie. **23rd July 2022** Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in Breed classes but when entering in Variety classes, wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. A first prize does not include a Special Prize of whatever value. If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:- **{1} Withdrawal:** The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulations 9 (j) and 20. **{2} Transfer: a)** If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and, in the event of there being no equivalent class. Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height. **b)** If an exhibit entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy class, Puppy class or Junior Class, which is over age but under 12 calendar months of age, 18 calendar months of age or 24 calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy class, Junior class or Yearling class respectively for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no Puppy, Junior class or Yearling class to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height. **c)** For any reason other than the above, the Show secretary shall transfer it to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height. **d)** If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

PUPPY: For dogs of 6 and not exceeding 12 calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

JUNIOR: For dogs of 6 and not exceeding 18 calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

YEARLING: For dogs of 12 and not exceeding 24 calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

POST GRADUATE: For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate/CACIB/CAC/Green Stars or 5 or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

LIMIT: For dogs which have not become Show Champions under The Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by The Kennel Club, or won 3 or more CC/CACIB/CAC/Green Stars or won 7 or more First prizes in all at Championship Shows in Limit and Open classes, confined to the breed, whether restricted or not, at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

OPEN: For dogs of the breeds for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show.

VETERAN: For dogs of not less than 7 years of age on the First day of the Show.

ADVISORY NOTE:

NOT FOR COMPETITION: Societies may at their discretion, accept Not for Competition entries. Societies may accept such entries from breeds of dog not included within the title of the Society and at Shows held over more than one day, such entries may be accepted on any day from any breed.

RULES and REGULATIONS

1. The Show will open at **9.00 am**
2. Dogs will be received at any time but it is the exhibitors responsibility to ensure that exhibits are available for judging when required.
3. Judging will commence ~ **10 AM**
4. Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed. The Show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed.
5. **ENTRY FEES: Non Members: £14.00 1st Entry per Dog ; Members: £13.00 1st Entry per Dog; Each subsequent entries with the same dog ~ Non Members : £4.00 each entry, Members : £4.00 ; N.F.C: £5.00 (including puppies aged between 4 – 6 months) *Prepaid Catalogue:* £3.00. (£3.5 on day of Show). Membership: Single £5.00; Joint £8.00 Advertisements £10.00 per page or £5.00 per ½ page.**
6. **PRIZE MONEY:** No prize money paid at this show.
7. The Committee reserve the right to refuse entries.
8. Puppies under six calendar months of age on the Show are not eligible for exhibition.
9. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.

10. **BEST PUPPY IN SHOW:** Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and is unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the same Show. A puppy is a dog of 6 and not exceeding 12 calendar months of age on the first day of the show. Where the Best of Breed or Best in Show is a puppy it may, at the discretion of the judge, be awarded Best Puppy in Show. Where the Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it may, at the discretion of the Judge be Best Puppy in Show. Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best in Show
11. **BEST IN SHOW:** The dog declared Best in Show is a dog which has competed and is unbeaten by any other dog exhibited at the same Show. Best in Show must be selected from the exhibits declared Best of Sex providing they are unbeaten winning dogs. Reserve Best in Show must be selected from the Best Opposite Sex and the Reserve Best of Sex to the exhibit declared Best in Show. The dog declared Best in Show and Reserve Best in Show must not compete in any subsequent competition. *Proviso: For the purposes of this Regulation, dogs beaten in competition for Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, progeny, Brace and Team or a Special Award confined to a single breed, will not be considered to be beaten dogs.*
12. Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with special permission of the Show Management.
13. Exhibitors must not pick up dogs by their tails and leads when lifting them nor handle a dog in a manner which causes its feet not to touch the ground when on the move. This is not acceptable. Exhibitors should note that such practice would constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulations F1
14. All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B) Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
15. All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
16. **DOGS IN VEHICLES ON HOT DAYS:**

Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events.

 - 1) When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
 - 2) If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
 - 3) The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
 - 4) Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
 - 5) When at the show never leave your dog in the vehicle
 - 6) Keep the dog in the shade - take your own shade, eg. a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
 - 7) Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time. Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare. **WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.**
17. Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog (s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under The Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. The use of pinch collars, electronic shock collars, or prong collars, is not permitted at any show licensed by The Kennel Club. This shall apply at the venue of within the precincts of the show.
18. Not for Competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered.
19. No modifications will be made to this Schedule except by permission of the General Committee of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine Press wherever possible.
20. **Security at shows:**

In light of recent events the Kennel Club would like to issue a reminder to all Societies of the importance of security at dog shows. The Kennel Club understands that due the nature of dog shows and the quantity of paraphernalia exhibitors bring it would be extremely difficult for show organisers to take on the issue of security alone, therefore, we would reiterate the advice being given by the Police and security services, that everyone in the UK should remain vigilant and this applies to those organising and taking part in dog shows. The importance of exhibitors feeling that

they and their dogs are safe when attending a show cannot be underestimated. We would therefore remind you of the importance of the need for show organisers and exhibitors to remain mindful of potential dangers and that all visitors generally need to be vigilant and alert. Furthermore, the society should provide robust notification informing exhibitors of where to report to should they see anything suspicious or of concern, and of the evacuation procedure in place.

21. A surcharge of £20.00 will be made on any cheque not honoured. Any exhibitor refusing to pay any outstanding entry fee and/or surcharge will be dealt with by the Kennel Club,
22. Should any judge be prevented from fulfilling his/her engagement the committee reserve the right to themselves to appoint another in his/her place. Exhibitors are at liberty to withdraw from competition but no entry fees can be returned.
23. Any owner, exhibitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog is required to remove as soon as possible any fouling caused by their dog(s) at any Kennel Club Licensed Show within the licensed venue and within the environs of that event including car and caravan parks and approaches. Adequate receptacles for the disposal of such fouling will be provided.
24. The Committee will do its utmost to ensure the safety of dogs brought for exhibition, but it must be clearly understood by exhibitors and all other persons at the Show that the Committee will not be responsible for the loss or damage to any dogs or property, or personal injury whether arising from accident or any other cause whatsoever.
25. An announcement prior to the date of closing of entries in Our Dogs of any alteration or addition made by the Committee to the schedule or in these Rules shall be sufficient notice thereof.
26. All children must be kept under control and parents will be responsible for any damage caused and charges incurred.
27. Please do not obstruct gangways with cages, pens, grooming tables, trolleys and dogs. Storage space will be made available for trolleys/cages.
28. If in the opinion of the Show Secretary, Show Manager or Judge any dog is considered not in a fit state for exhibition owing to a disease, savage disposition, or any other cause, the dog may be excluded or removed from the show the must no be brought into the show at any time under any circumstances.
29. No animal other than the exhibit duly entered at the show will be allowed within the precincts of the show during its continuance.
30. The owner, exhibitor, handler of other person in charge of the dog at a Kennel Club licensed event must at all times ensure that the dog is kept under control whilst at the licensed venue, including its environs, car and caravan parks and approaches. This regulation applied before (at any time during the set up period at the venue), during the event and afterwards (at any time during the breakdown of the event).
31. A dog may be disqualified by the Board from any award, whether an objection has been lodged or not, if proved amongst other things to have been a) registered or recorded as having been bred by the scheduled judge, thi shall not apply to a judge appointed in an emergency; b) exhibited without payment of the appropriate entry fee.

*** * PLEASE NOTE * ***

**Puppies over 4 months of age may be entered NOT FOR COMPETITION at this Show.
Puppies under six calendar months of age or not eligible for exhibition.**

REGULATIONS FOR THE PREPARATION OF DOGS FOR EXHIBITION F (B)

1. These Regulations must be observed when a dog is prepared for exhibition for any Kennel Club Licensed event.
(a) Objections may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under these Show Regulations and/or for disciplinary action Kennel Club Rule A11. (b) Unless the exhibitor provides a satisfactory explanation for the dog being exhibited in breach of these Regulations then he/she may be subject to further penalties of either a fine or as listed under Rule A11.
2. (a) No substance which alters the natural colour, texture or body of the coat may be present in the dog's coat for any purpose at any time during the show. No substance which alters the natural colour of any external part of the dog may be present on the dog for any purpose at any time during the show. (b) Any other substance (other than water) which may be used in preparation of the dog for exhibition must not be allowed to remain in the coat or on any other part of the dog at the time of exhibition.
3. No act or operation which alters the natural conformation of a dog or any part thereof may be performed except:- (a) Operations certified to the satisfaction of the Board. (b) The removal of dew-claws of any breed. (c) Operations to prevent breeding provided that such operations are notified to the Kennel Club before neutered dogs are shown. Nor must anything be done calculated in the opinion of the Board to deceive.
4. The Board without previous notice may order an examination of any dog or dogs at any Show. Any examination thus ordered will be made by a person having executive authority who shall have a written directive from the Kennel Club in their possession. Samples may be taken for further examination and analysis.
5. An individual has the right to lodge an objection to a dog if he/she is the owner or handler of a dog competing in the same breed or class. An objection may however, be lodged by an official of the Show or by anyone so deputed by the Kennel Club. It will be the responsibility of the individual who lodges the objection or the official (as appropriate) to substantiate the grounds for the objection. The Kennel Club will substantiate the grounds for an objection made on its behalf.
6. Any objection by an individual related to an infringement of these regulations must be made in writing to the Show Secretary or his/her office before the close of the Show and the individual must produce evidence of identity at the time of lodging the complaint.

DOGS IN VEHICLES ON HOT DAYS

Your dog is vulnerable and AT RISK if left in a vehicle in high temperatures and even on Days considered as slightly warm.

If your dog is found to be at risk forcible entry to your vehicle may be necessary without liability for any damage caused.

CHEQUES

The Society name must be written in full or your cheque will be returned.

The banks are now scanning cheques as you pay them in. Cheques that are not written using black ink, or don't have the society name written in full, will be rejected. Failure to follow the above criteria means your entry will be returned.

COVID SAFE ENVIRONMENT

This show will be run under the guidelines of the Government and the Kennel Club at the time of the show. Any exhibitor, handler or spectator who has show symptoms of Covid or have been tested positive for Covid within the past 10 days. MUST NOT ATTEND THE SHOW. Similarly, if you have been in contact with someone who has tested positive with Covid or have been instructed by the NJS Test and Trace to isolate, you also must not attend the show.
